ABOUT THE FILM

Our environment—Mother Earth and biodiversity—is inextricably connected to our ongoing existence. That's the message of 14-year-old Diya Payal's film, SEEDS OF LIFE. This spirituality and approach to life infuses the work on the fields tended on her grandparents' farm, located in the foothills of the Himalayas in India. Diya tells the story of generations of farmers who live off the land and sell the surplus crops they grow, and the importance of preserving and growing indigenous organic seeds versus industrially produced and genetically modified seeds.

"Food and farming is deeply connected to our spiritual and cultural relationship with the natural world. I wanted to share this idea with other young people, in the hope that we will choose to coexist in harmony with nature for the future of the planet and humanity, too." —Diya Payal
